It Really Boils Down to One Simple Question


Is it reasonably easy to get from here to there?

Driving: 3 hours 24 minutes






Far Too Often, It Isn't Easy At All

How About High Speed Rail?



Great, but will it get you to Pullman or Walla Walla, and sometime before 2040?



We Support High Speed Rail as Part of an Integrated System

- The High Speed Rail Alliance envisions an <u>integrated</u> <u>network approach</u> including high-speed, regional and shared-use lines.
- Almost all high-speed rail systems-including China,
 Japan and most of Europe-have been built on a foundation of a robust conventional rail system.
- We have a conventional rail system, but it is not robust



How Do We Get To High-Speed Rail?

- Get more frequent and faster trains running as soon as possible on the existing infrastructure.
- 6 daily trains was the "takeoff point" for the multi-million-rider passenger corridors in California (We have three daily trains to Portland today.)
- Start planning now for high-speed rail in twenty years.




Options Available Today

- Amtrak Cascades to Eugene, Portland, Vancouver BC
- Sounder to Everett and Tacoma
- Amtrak Coast Starlight to Los Angeles
- Amtrak Empire Builder to Chicago





People Already Ride Trains



Who rides trains? Not who you expect.

- 2.25 Million Annual Amtrak Passengers from PNW (WA, OR, ID, MT) States
 - ~1 Million diverted car trips
 - ~700,000 diverted plane trips
 - ~300,000 would have stayed home
 - ~240,000 diverted bus trips



Our Vision

A transportation network that:

- Provides seamless, door-to-door connectivity to everyone in the region; and
- Offers economic, environmental and equity benefits to all, including low-income, tribal, disability and rural communities, locations where transportation alternatives are limited, and those who cannot drive



Our Goal

We must build a transportation network that will allow anyone to get from their homes to where they need to go – work, school, medical care, family and friends – even if they don't use a car.


Non-drivers are <u>30 percent</u> of the population, including **the young, the old, the disabled, the poor,** and those who are **concerned about the planet's future**. And that percentage is increasing.

Intercity passenger trains help strengthen local economies across the Northwest.



Intercity passenger trains provide low-emissions regional transportation.



Intercity passenger trains connect communities small and large.



Economic Benefits

Easy travel options help strengthen local economies throughout the Northwest.

On average, communities receive \$84 per day-trip visitor, and \$366 per overnight visitor, according to Experience Washington.

Rail is the optimal low-impact freight and passenger ground transportation option.

Rail does not contribute to salmon die-off related to tires.

AAWA's 2023 Legislative Priorities

- 1. Restore Pre-Pandemic Rail Services
- 2. Expand Research on a Complete, Statewide Passenger and Freight Rail Network
 - Follow in <u>California</u> and <u>Virginia's footsteps</u>
 - Benefit-Cost Analyses and Economic Impact Analyses
- 3. Submit an "expression of interest" letter to the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA)
- 4. Establish a working group leading to an Interstate Rail Compact


