

It Really Boils Down to One Simple Question


Is it reasonably easy to get from here to there?

Driving: 4 hours 19 minutes






Far Too Often, It Isn't Easy At All

We Support High Speed Rail as Part of an Integrated System

- The High Speed Rail Alliance envisions an <u>integrated</u> <u>network approach</u> including high-speed, regional and shared-use lines.
- Almost all high-speed rail systems-including China, Japan and most of Europe-have been built on a foundation of a robust conventional rail system.



How Do We Get To High-Speed Rail?

- Get more frequent and faster trains running as soon as possible on the existing infrastructure.
- Start planning now for high-speed rail in twenty years.



Options Available Today

- Amtrak Cascades to Eugene, Portland
- Sounder to Everett and Tacoma
- Amtrak Coast Starlight to Los Angeles
- Amtrak *Empire Builder* to Chicago









Our Vision

A transportation network that:

- Provides seamless, door-to-door connectivity to everyone in the region; and
- Offers economic, environmental and equity benefits to all, including *low-income, tribal, disability and rural communities*, locations where transportation alternatives are limited, and those who cannot drive



Our Goal

We must build a transportation network that will allow anyone to get from their homes to where they need to go – **work**, **school, medical care, family and friends – even if they don't use a car.**

Non-drivers are a large and increasing fraction of the population, including **the young, the old, the disabled, the poor,** and those who are **concerned about the planet's future**.

- Frequent Amtrak trains crossing the entire Northwest
- More stations
- A competitive freight rail system
- Better connections to other modes

Economy

Intercity passenger trains help strengthen local economies across the Northwest.



Environment

Intercity passenger trains provide low-emissions regional transportation.



Equity

Intercity passenger trains connect communities small and large.



Economic Benefits

Easy travel options help strengthen local economies throughout the Northwest.

On average, communities receive \$84 per day-trip visitor, and \$366 per overnight visitor, according to Experience Washington.





Environmental Benefits

Rail is the optimal low-impact freight and passenger ground transportation option.

Rail does not contribute to salmon die-off related to tires.





Equity Benefits

A good freight and passenger rail network contributes to high quality of life in our region for everyone.

- Improves reach of local services
- Expands access for all communities





AAWA's 2023 Legislative Priorities

- 1. Restore Pre-Pandemic Rail Services
- 2. Expand Research on a Complete, Statewide Passenger and Freight Rail Network
 - Follow in <u>Virginia's footsteps</u>
- 3. Form a Washington Rail Advisory Committee
 - Give rail users and stakeholders a louder voice, similar to the <u>Ferry</u>
 <u>Riders Opinion Group</u> and <u>organizations in other states</u>
- 4. Improve Rail Safety
